- His owner Adriano Sorella paid the \$61,690 supplemental fee to enter the eliminations, and Jimmy Freight finished in a deadheat for third with Dorsoduro Hanover to advance to the pace Final. Jimmy freight drew post four, which has won four of 41 editions.
- People seem to think that when you automatically have money you are going to spend like that,” said Sorella. “I own the horse and have no partners, so I have to write the check myself. It was a tough pill to swallow, let me tell you. It wasn’t easy. I talked with the trainer Richard Moreau, and he said this is a nice horse and you don’t get chances like this. It might not happen again, so let’s give it a shot.”
- Came into his Pace elimination off an easy win in a career best 1:49.2 in an Ontario Sires Stakes Gold elimination at Mohawk.
- “Mark Reynolds is an agent I use quite often and he found this horse racing on the fair circuit in Iowa. He cost \$115,000 US, won his first OSS Gold race for me, then we thought we had a nice horse and he’s just progressed.”
- Louis Philippe Roy, the 2016 O’Brien Award Future Star winner, is currently the top driver on the powerful Woodbine Entertainment Group Circuit and makes his Pace debut. Roy, 28, from Quebec, is a rising star coming off his first \$4 million season with 447 wins in 2017. “Louis is a top driver on the WEG Circuit and Richard’s guy,” said Sorella. “I really like to have a driver and horse together, and that’s it. Louis is my guy.”
- Trainer Andrew Harris, 33, is from Hamilton, Ontario and makes his Pace debut. The former assistant to Casie Coleman comes off his first \$3 million season with 147 wins.
- His sire Sportswriter, the 2009 champion freshman pacer in Canada and the US, finished seventh in the 2010 Pace and never raced again.
