

# Stay Hungry

- Rallied to win the first Pace elimination in career best of 1:49 as the 2-1 second choice, and drew the rail, which has won the Pace in four of 41 editions.
- Came into his Pace elimination off a close fourth in the Hempt Final after a second to Lather Up in his elimination. His lone win this season came in a North America Cup elimination in 1:50. Parked first over from post eight he finished sixth in that Final.
- As a freshman, he won the O'Brien Award as Canada's top two year old in 2017 and rallied to a Breeders Crown upset at Hoosier Park in 1:50.4.
- Stay Hungry is one of three Pace finalists for trainer Tony Alagna. Alagna, 45, added to his reputation for developing major young stars in 2017 by pulling a Breeders Crown upset with Stay Hungry, and the two-year old son of Somebeachsomewhere finished a close second in the Governor's Cup. Alagna's late-blooming American History finished third in that event in only his fifth lifetime start. That son of American Ideal posted the fastest mile of 2018 with a 1:47 win on June 29, and finished second in the fastest elimination. Alagna campaigned two-time O'Brien Award winner Caprice Hill and may have a 2018 Hambletonian prospect in Missile Hill. The Alagna Stable passed the \$3 million mark for the seventh consecutive season.
- Alagna sent five starters into the Pace eliminations. Babes Dig Me made the final along with elimination winner Stay Hungry and American History. Alagna won his Meadowlands Pace debut in 2013 with two-time Pacer of the Year Captaintreacherous. In his previous starts, Wake Up Peter finished seventh, Revenge Shark finished fifth, Artspeak finished sixth and Racing Hill finished second with Brett Miller driving in 2016. That son of Pace champion Roll With Joe gave Alagna his 1,000<sup>th</sup> training win with a Breeders Crown stakes record of 1:48.
- His super sire the late Somebeachsomewhere suffered his only career loss in 21 starts in the 2008 Pace when he was upset by Art Official in a world record 1:47. From his first crop, he sired 2013 Pace winner and Tony Alagna trainee Captaintreacherous, whose own first crop have been outstanding this season. He sired the one-two finishers in last year's Pace, Huntsville and Downbytheseaside. He sent out seven of the 15 in last week's eliminations and five advanced to the final, including elimination winner Stay Hungry.
- Stay Hungry is the fifth foal out of three-time Breeders Crown champion My Little Dragon, 1:48.1 [\$2,318,623].
- Rising star Doug McNair makes his Pace debut. McNair is Canada's defending Driver of the Year, hit the 3,000 wins plateau on May 25 and won his first WEG Circuit driving title in 2017.
